With reference to the tender enquiry P/I/NC/141/PS/DB/OLT/20-21, following clauses may be read as follows instead as mentioned in the tender document.

INVITATION FOR BIDS / NIT Point 6

- a) As per Govt. of India procurement policies the eligibility of the suppliers is restricted to Class I and Class II local suppliers as per Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Govt. of India, vide OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 04 June 2020, dated 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and subsequent amendments as per the definition below*
- b) As per Govt. of India, the procuring entity intends to give purchase preferences to products /goods manufactured by Micro & Small Enterprises as per rules in force.

*"Class-I Local supplier" means a supplier or service provider whose product or service offered for procurement, has local content equal to or more than 50% as defined as prescribed in DIPP Order No.P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 4th June, 2020 dated 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and subsequent amendments or by the competent Ministries/Departments in pursuance of this order.

"Class-II Local supplier" means a supplier of service provider, whose goods or service offered for procurement, has local content more than 20% but less than 50% as defined as prescribed in DIPP Order No.P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 4th June, 2020 dated 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and subsequent amendments or by the competent Ministries/Departments in pursuance of this order.

'Local content' means the amount of value added in India which shall, unless otherwise prescribed by the Nodal Ministry, be the total value of the items procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (including all customs duties) as a proportion of the total value, in percent.

The above bidders are required to indicate percentage of local content and provide self-certification that the items offered meets the local content requirement for Class-I/Class-II as the case may be.

Further the bidders shall also give then details of the location at which the local value addition is made.

Bidders offering imported products will fall under the Category of Non-Local suppliers. They can't claim themselves as Class-I local supplier / Class-II local supplier by claiming profit, warehousing, marketing, logistics, freight etc. as local value addition.

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NOTE TO BIDDERS

Bids/Tenders are invited only from Class I/Class II local suppliers. Provisions of the Public Procurement (preference to Make in India) order issued by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Govt. of India, vide OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 04 June 2020, OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dt. 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and subsequent amendments shall be applicable in Tendering Process.

Clause 1.9.2

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For the above purpose, local supplier means a supplier or service provider whose product or service offered for procurement meets the minimum local content as prescribed in DIPP Order No.P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 04th June, 2020, OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dt. 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and amendments or by the Ministries/Departments in pursuance of this order and local content means the amount of value added in India which shall, unless otherwise prescribed by the Nodal Ministry, be the total value of the items procured (excluding net domestic indirect taxes) minus the value of imported content in the item (including all customs duties) as a proportion of the total value, in percent.

Clause 1.32.3

Purchase preference shall be given to all local Suppliers in all procurements undertaken by the Purchaser in the manner prescribed by the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, Govt. of India, vide OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dated 04 June 2020, OM No. P-45021/2/2017-PP (BE-II) dt. 16th September, 2020, No. P-45021/102/2019-PP (BE-II) (E-29930) dt. 26th November, 2020 and subsequent amendments

For all procurements above 5 lakhs undertaken by the purchaser, purchase preference shall be given to Class I local suppliers in the following manner:

- a) Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is 'Class-I local supplier', the contract for full quantity will be awarded to L1.
- b) If L1 bid is not a 'Class-I local supplier, 50% of the order quantity shall be awarded to L1. Thereafter, the lowest bidder among the 'Class-I local supplier' will be invited to match the L1 price for the remaining 50% quantity subject to the Class-I local supplier's quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and contract for that quantity shall be awarded to such 'Class-I local supplier' subject to matching the L1 price. In case such lowest eligible 'Class-I local supplier' fails to match the L1 price or accepts less than the offered quantity, the next higher 'Class-I local supplier' within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price for remaining quantity and so on, and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case some quantity is still left uncovered on Class-I

local suppliers, then such balance quantity may also be ordered on the L1 bidder.

c) In the procurements of goods or works, which are covered by above para and which are not divisible in nature, and in procurement of services where the bid is evaluated on price alone, the Class-I local supplier shall get purchase preference over Class-II local supplier as well as Non-local supplier as per following procedure.

i) Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is Class-I local supplier, the contract will be awarded to L1.

ii) If L1 is not 'Class-I local supplier', the lowest bidder among the 'Class-I local suppliers, will be invited to match the L1 price subject to Class-I local supplier's quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference and the contract shall be awarded to such 'Class-I local supplier' subject to matching the L1 price.

iii) In case such lowest eligible 'Class-I local supplier' fails to match the L1 price, the Class-I local supplier with the next higher bid within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price and so on and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case none of the 'Class-I local suppliers' within the margin of purchase preference matches the L1 price, then the contract may be awarded to the L1 bidder

D) 'Class-II local supplier' will not get purchase preference in any procurement undertaken by the procuring entity.

The above amendments shall amount to amendments of the relevant terms of our Bid Document for CGCRI Tender No. P/I/NC/141/PS/DB/OLT/20-21.

All the other Tender terms remain unchanged.
